WHAT LEVEL ARE YOU LIVING AT?

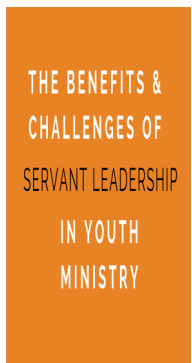

YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT CHALLENGE

The Luke Project 52 Clinic is in urgent need of teams to serve in our child care ministry. This service is crucial to enabling our Moms to keep their prenatal care appointments. Many have no community support system and thus no one to watch their other children while they get their healthcare needs met and so they don't keep their prenatal appointments. The lack of prenatal care is the #1 cause of infant mortality in Michigan. If your High School or College or church Youth Group would be willing to serve a 4 hour shift once every two months on the 1st or 3rd Thursday of each month from 3-7 PM you might just be helping save a babies life!
